# Parish Council News

Work on the car park is due to start soon. Councillors discussed the Queen's Green Canopy which has been set up via the Woodland Trust to encourage trees to be planted. We will register our interest for the next delivery which will be in Autumn and will be used in the new car park.

The broken basket swing has been removed and a more heavy duty replacement basket swing will be purchased which should arrive later this month and hopefully be installed in time for Easter.

Some parishioners reported damage to tyres from the road near Warter Estate. The concerns were reported to the Farm Manager's secretary and we were pleased to see that two vehicles were sent out with brushes to clean the road which is now clear.

All planning applications are on the ERYC planning portal and we would encourage parishioners to check this on a regular basis and make any comments using the online portal <https://newplanningaccess.eastriding.gov.uk/>. Future applications will be shared on the village information WhatsApp Group for your information.

Plans are in place for Huggate's Jubilee Celebration with events on the 3rd and 4th June that the PCC are kindly organising— more information will be in future newsletters and on the Whatsapp group.
