Don't forget about the **bug hotel** which is situated in the woods to the right of the second pond, if anyone would like to help keep it functioning, it needs more twigs and small branches.

A **new clerk** has been appointed. Penny Hudson is retired and lives in Pocklington. She is completing a handover with Abby over the next month.

We would like to thank Abby for her hard work and professionalism over her time as clerk and wish her all the best for the future. She has been a great asset to the village.

There will be no parish council meeting in August.

We have been approached by Linda from **Hedgehogs R Us**. As hedgehog numbers are in decline she is asking for villages to get involved in their conservation. It involves creating 5 inch gaps in fences to allow them to forage for food and meet mates. Hedgehog shaped fence surrounds made from recycled plastic will be supplied to raise awareness of the plight of hedgehogs. If anyone is interested in taking part please email Penny.

## St. Mary's Church Development Project

The final authorisation from York Diocese to start work on phase 1 of St Mary's National Lottery Heritage Fund (NLHF) project is due very soon. This will see the drainage improved, a water supply to the church, removal of the pews, a new floor being laid and a new heating system installed. Plans for the alterations can be seen during daylight hours on the boards in church. The Victorian Society and Historic England are happy about the reordering of your village's church which is described by Historic England as

"particularly special for its 12th century nave and arcades. The remarkable survival of the 12th century decorative, carved stone is the reason for the Grade I listing of the church. This places it in the top 2% of buildings in the country listed for their exceptional historic and architectural interest."



The next stage once the authorisation is received work will be laying mains water to the church with pipework being installed down Church Lane by Yorkshire Water and from the boundary to the church by an independent contractor. Clearly this will affect access to the church and nearby properties and the PCC will keep villagers informed on start dates and length of disruption, and aim to minimise the impact of the work.

Following this new drainage will be installed north of the church the heating and floor replaced For this we would appreciate any help villagers could provide in removing the pews, old floor and tiles and we will let you know when we need to start the work. These volunteer' contributions are extremely important to NLHF when deciding if we can have the grant we applied for, so any help you can offer is significant for providing a facility available to the whole village. As well as the capital works we are running **four heritage projects** that provide opportunities for villagers of all ages to get involved with preserving the history of the village and church for future generations and learn some new skills. These are important to the NLHF and we will be providing more information on these over the coming months.

While the NLHF is providing 85% of the costs of phase 1, we have spent many thousands on the preparatory work and reports. We are grateful to all who have donated and raised funds to make this possible. As work begins, fundraising and grant applications continue in preparation for Phase 2 which will include the toilet, servery and lighting.
