
St. MARY'S CHURCH

Church Flooring

The contractors Pinnacle have started the work of reflooring. The nave has been dug out the depth needed for the limecrete floor to be installed. The next phase will be to move the font to the north west end of the nave. After this they will start the floor with an insulating layer, then limecrete screed

and finally when it that has cured the new stone floor

Remnants of the Early Medieval floor have been exposed, an unusual survival inside a church; and a fire pit which the archaeologists think could have been used to melt the lead for the windows.



Dates are being arranged over the Easter holiday for groups safely to access the church, to see the work so far and the finds in the church - notification will be on WhatsApp.

Churchyard Work on maintaining the churchyard will begin again on Tuesday evenings on **9th April from 6 o'clock**.
