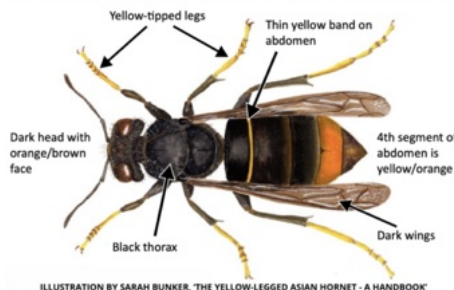

The Asian hornet

Smaller than native hornets (about 2.5cm)
Orange head from front and black from top
Abdomen almost entirely dark, with fine yellow stripes and a yellow or orange 4th segment near the base
Black or brown thorax
Legs with yellow tips, like they've been dipped in paint
