Wolds proposed Area of Outstanding Natural Beauty

An AONB designates an area of exceptional landscape wildness tranquility cultural heritage.



Statutory consultation on the designation of the Wolds area will take place in the second half of 2023.

A consultation is now in progress to identify the **candidate area** for designation, which currently includes Huggate. Full information is on the web site <https://www.yorkshire-wolds-designation-project.org/home>.

The "**Have your say**" tab gives various means of providing feedback on the candidate area, with a **response deadline of 8th July.**

Area of Outstanding Natural Beauty information is at the back of church if anyone wants to look at the documents. Please leave them there for other people to look at.
