There were two very enjoyable and well attended coffee mornings in the Church in January as part of the Jo Cox Great Winter Get Together initiative to bring communities together in what can be a dark and depressing month.

Because they were so popular we have decided to hold a **monthly coffee morning in Church**.

With each of the future coffee mornings there will be a donation tin for a **designated charity**. If you have suggestions for charities please let us know. The February money will go to The Peoples Pantry in Pocklington. Donations are entirely voluntary so please still come along even if you don't want to donate as the event is free.

## PARISH COUNCIL NEWS

The **noticeboard** is now in place in the village car park, if any local businesses are interested in promoting themselves please provide a small postcard sized card promoting your Business to any of the parish councillors.

The last <u>village questionnaire</u> was carried out in early 2020 in conjunction with St Mary's Church. Highlights included:

- We should carry on funding the production of the Huggate News

- The purchase of a basket swing was supported by most of the residents

- Speeding and dangerous parking in the village were a concern.

Following this feedback, we have:

- Continued to fund the Huggate News production

- Purchased, maintained and then replaced the basket swing on the green

- Arranged Speedwatch training through Humberside Police which is gratefully coordinated by a very willing group of volunteers - Created a village car park

We ran **<u>defibrillator training</u>** at the end of 2019 that was very well attended; some residents who were unable to attend stated they were interested in attending another session and whilst we haven't organised this yet, we will consider running another session later this year.

Whilst Councillors don't feel the need to coordinate another questionnaire, if you have any areas / issues / subjects that you would like questioning then please do get in touch with any of the Councillors or the clerk so we can decide whether it is viable to do a questionnaire this year. We are planning to have a <u>village rounders</u> <u>match / tournament</u> in the summer, watch this space for further information but please do come along to participate or simply spectate from afar on a deckchair with a drink!

We are considering purchasing some sort of **marquee** that can be used for village / church events should the weather not be very kind. This could be lent out to residents if they wish to use for their own events. We are still in the early stages of researching possible options and as we don't have a community space / village hall then there may be funding options available which are being investigated.

The agenda for the next meeting will be displayed at least 3 days beforehand on the notice board in the bus shelter; minutes and agendas are also on the Huggate Village Website https://huggatevillage.org/villagemeetings.

The next meeting will be on Tuesday 21st February at 7pm in the Juliarnos Room on Mill Lane.
